AIM Days: Your child will receive services once a week on a grade-specific day. They will stay in the AIM classroom with their cohort all day, except for specials, which they will attend with their homeroom.

Homework: Your child may be assigned a special project that will need to be completed at home. Also, any work not completed in class will need to be completed and returned the next day.

News: I will make every effort to send you an email after the day ends to let you know what we did that day and what will be coming up in the next class. I will use the email addresses provided when you registered your child for school. If this is not the address you wish to use, please let your homeroom teacher, the office, or me know.

Units & Projects: All grade levels will work on a special unit in class each semester. The majority of the work will be completed in AIM class. If absent from AIM, time at home may be needed to get caught up on the project and to stay on schedule for the assigned due date.

Conduct: Good behavior is expected and important to ensure a productive learning environment. On occasion, I may need to write a note to you in your child's agenda. Please initial the note.

Grades: Grades are given for various assignments done in class, as well as current events, projects, and participation. AIM also has a grade for behavior on the report cards. First and second grades use the O,S,N, U system, while third through fifth grades use A,B,C,D,F.

Specials/Art, Music, PE, & STEM
Your children will attend specials with
their homeroom at their designated time
& location each AIM day, as they do
every other day.

Lunch: We will go to lunch together as an entire AIM class. Our lunch time is @ 11:45-12:45. Please remind your children to bring their lunch boxes to AIM when they arrive each morning. Per school policy, you will not be able to eat lunch with any child other than your own (in Café or courtyard) unless you have a written note from that parent.





We will have snack time each AIM day. Please send in a healthy snack with your child. We are a peanut free class and only water is allowed to drink in AIM. Please remind your children to bring their snacks when they come to AIM. Your children will not be allowed to return & interrupt their homerooms to get it.
